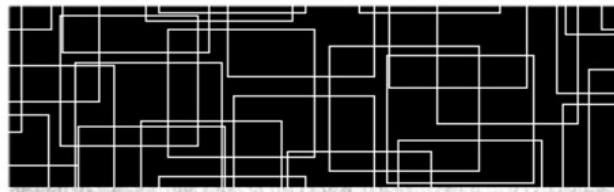

Program Background

A driver's license is a crucial tool in accessing further education, training and employment, and also in contributing to community life. This targeted program aims to impart life preserving driving strategies, and accredited training with links to identified career pathways in the region of delivery.

Program Components

This program is in two parts, to be run concurrently to provide students with the greatest exposure to safe driving practices and achieving required behind the wheel & Certificate Nominal Hours.

Part 1 - Licensing

Overview

Students will undertake as required by Transport SA, 75 behind the wheel hours in order to be eligible to obtain their probationary license. This behind the wheel time will be assigned to various tasks however areas of focus will be customized to the development needs of the student. Some areas covered under the 75 hours will be as follows; however not exhaustive:

- Dusk/Dawn Drive
- Town/Country Drive
- Slow Speed Manoeuvres
- Sealed/Unsealed Road
- Highway Drive
- Stop/Start
- Vehicle Control
- Car Knowledge
- Basic Car Operational Knowledge
- Parking

This training package will ensure that all students cover off the prerequisite hours required by the State Government.

Students will not only be safe & competent drivers, they will be fitted with the basic skills & knowledge for driving in most situations & conditions.

A successful assessment outcome for this course will be students having completed required prerequisite hours of driving experience sit a VORT test & obtain a Class C license.

The course is specifically designed for students who want to obtain their Probationary license or who wish to obtain a greater understanding of road safety & safe driving practices. Students who do not have the ability to complete their mandatory behind the wheel driving hours due to circumstances or lack of vehicle availability, would also highly benefit from this program.

Entry Requirements

Students must hold current Learners permit or willing to obtain one in order to undertake course. Students must be willing to learn & be able understand Basic English commands in order to undertake the training.

Part 2 - Certificate II in Driving Operations - General TLI21209

Overview

This qualification is designed for driving operation job roles within the transport and distribution industry. Successful completion of the qualification will require competence in units of competency that relate to the job role requirements defined as aligned at AQF Level II. Successful completion of the licensing units within the qualification must align with licensing and regulatory requirements applicable to driving and state/territory regulatory requirements.

Course Content

Student Performance & Ongoing Evaluation

Evaluation of the student capability is to be on a regular basis & in line with legislative requirements for completion of any units for receiving full certification.

Target Audience

The course is specifically designed for students who want to obtain a greater understanding of road safety & safe driving practices. Students who are particularly interested in potential further employment potentially within the Transport & Logistics Sector would receive greatest benefit from this course.

Entry Requirements

Students must have a desire to learn & develop their skills in the transport & logistics field. This Certification provides the foundation for students interested to further educate themselves through Certificate III or even a Traineeship/Apprenticeship.
